Each year prisoners with serious mental illnesses are released into communities across America. Typically, mentally ill offenders leave prison with a bus ticket, \$75, and two weeks worth of medication. Within 18 months, nearly two-thirds are re-arrested. FRONTLINE examines what happens to the mentally ill when they leave prison and why they return at such alarming rates. The intimate stories of *The Released*—along with interviews with parole officers, social workers, and psychiatrists—provide a rare look at the lives of the mentally ill as they struggle to stay out of prison and reintegrate into society.
